Group Warns That Extending Wiretaps Laws Beyond Congressional Intent Could Stall Technology Benefits

**Background:** Today the FCC made an initial decision to extend the Communications and Law Enforcement Act (CALEA) to an information service – VoIP. They are expected to act more specifically in the weeks ahead.
