On November 15, 2016, the undersigned, together with Ann Marie Rohaly, and Jim Thatcher of Microsoft and Glenn Richards of the Voice on the Net (VON) Coalition, spoke by telephone with Rosaline Crawford, Michael Scott, and Suzy Rosen Singleton of the Commission's Consumer and Governmental Affairs Bureau.

The Microsoft representatives discussed various points outlined in their reply comments filed in the above-referenced proceedings. Specifically, they noted that given that over-the-top (OTT) applications rely on the best efforts internet, the FCC should recognize the inherent characteristics and limitations of such applications and their inability to guarantee performance criteria, including with respect to access to emergency services. Mr. Thatcher and Mr. Richards also explained that even where OTT applications provide interconnected VoIP service, they may still use the best efforts internet and, as a result, may be unable to guarantee the proposed performance requirements. The parties also emphasized the importance of avoiding any confusion with respect to consumer expectations around the use of an OTT application to contact emergency services.

Microsoft also asked the Commission to make clear which applications, services and devices would be subject to any real-time text rules it adopts. Clear guidance will better ensure that industry can incorporate the necessary changes and will help to establish clear consumer expectations.
